
Edward PACT

Edward PACT is located primarily in the southwest section of Hickory. Edward PACT is comprised of commercial and industrial neighborhoods. Three main arteries run through Edward



Community Services PACT



Lt. Scott Hildebrand

Lt. Scott Hildebrand has worked with Hickory Police Department since 1994, both in patrol and criminal investigations. Hildebrand has an Associate of Applied Science and Bachelor of Science degree in Criminal Justice as well as a Bachelor of Arts degree in Psychology.

"Crime is a problem that affects everyone and it should be a concern for everyone. If we all are vigilant, then together we can make a difference," said Lt. Hildebrand.

Crime Prevention

Hickory Police Department's Crime Prevention Unit is one of two specialty units which fall under the Community Services Pact. The Crime Prevention Unit partners with other area agencies in an effort to reduce community crime and educate citizens. Some of the functions of the Crime Prevention Unit (CPU) include: conducting public speaking engagements, providing workshops to community groups and organizations, organizing community watch programs, giving tours of the police department, and participating in other community functions.

School Resource Officers

The school resource officers are assigned to Hickory City public schools. Each high school has one school resource that patrols his or her school as his or her primary assignment. In addition,

each middle school is assigned a school resource officer who rotates his or her duties to cover Hickory's elementary schools. The middle school resource officers are certified Drug Abuse Resistance Education (D.A.R.E.) instructors. Each year, the officers deliver this program to approximately 450 sixth grade students. The curriculum focuses on drug resistance, violence and gang prevention, and decision making skills. SRO's (School Resource Officers) have a number of responsibilities that include: investigating criminal incidences; enforcing federal, state and local laws and ordinances; conducting security inspections to deter criminal or delinquent activities; establishing a close partnership with school administrators in order to provide for a safe school environment; and increasing the visibility and accessibility of police to the school community.

Special Operations Team

The Special Operations Team is a group of specially trained officers that come together when a tactical response is needed. The mission of the Special Operations Team is to respond to and stabilize any critical incidents while reducing the chance of injury to all persons involved. Members of the team have primary assignments within the department, but are on call 24 hours a day, seven days a week, and are ready to respond at a moment's notice. The team trains utilizing scenario based training in adverse conditions to prepare for any critical incident that may arise.

K9 Unit

The Hickory Police Department Canine Unit functions as a service to enhance the operations of Police Patrol PACTS and Narcotics. The canine teams are deployed on high risk calls for service, narcotic searches for fugitives/missing persons as well as protect the police handler and other officers, building searches and tracking. Currently the police department has four canines that work on patrol handling calls for police service. Each canine is certified annually.
