

Fair Housing Month

April is Fair Housing Month, and the City of Hickory is committed to affirmatively furthering Fair Housing in the community. The Fair Housing Act prohibits discrimination in the sale or rental of housing based on race, color, national origin, religion, sex, familial status, or handicap. The City of Hickory offers housing rehabilitation programs that aim to improve the quality of the local housing stock and make improvements that prevent the displacement of low to moderate income homeowners. The following programs are only available to homeowners that live inside the Hickory city limits:

The Housing Rehabilitation Loan Program provides loans of up to \$25,000 to homeowners whose household income does not exceed 80 percent of the area median income. Funds can be used to bring housing units up to the City's minimum housing code and for accessibility improvements necessary for residents with disabilities. Examples of eligible repairs include heat system replacement, window replacement,

plumbing repairs, repairs of electrical wiring, and roof repairs. No monthly payments are required on the loan, as long as the house is maintained as the principal residence of the borrower. In addition, half of the loan balance is forgiven if the borrower maintains the home as a primary residence for at least five years.

The **Urgent Repair Program** provides forgivable loans to homeowners of up to \$12,000 to households with special needs whose income does not exceed 50 percent of the statewide median income. These funds may be used for urgent repairs or accessibility improvements that are required to avert the displacement of the homeowner.

Mulch and Leaf Compost Available

Ever wonder what happens with the yard waste collected by Hickory Solid Waste crews throughout the year? The tree limbs, Christmas trees, and leaves put to the curb are ground into useable material for your landscape! Each spring, the City of Hickory begins its sales of mulch and leaf compost to the general public. Mulch and leaf compost are now available at the City's Yard Waste Facility on Cloninger Mill Road. The facility is open Fridays and Saturdays from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m., and will operate with those hours until all supply is gone. Double ground and single ground mulch will be available. Double ground mulch is \$50 per 3-yard scoop (full-size pickup truck load). Single ground mulch is \$25 per 3-yard scoop (full-size pickup truck load). Leaf compost is \$25 per 3-yard scoop (full-size pickup truck load). For more information, call the Hickory Public Services Department at 828-323-7500.

Spring Reminders

Spring is here and residents are asked to remember these helpful instructions.

Pool Fill Adjustments: Call the Collections Division at 828-323-7424 at least one business day BEFORE filling up your swimming pool from the ground up so you may receive an adjustment on your water bill. City staff MUST read your water meter before and after the pool is filled to ensure an accurate volume.

Lawn Sprinkler Meters: The City of Hickory must be contacted to activate irrigation meters to avoid potential tampering charges being added for meters that were turned on by an unauthorized person. To activate a lawn sprinkler meter, call Collections at 828-323-7424 Monday through Friday between 8:30 a.m. and 5 p.m. Also, remember to call Collections at the end of the season to inactivate the service and discontinue monthly base charges.
